This is the dramatic account of the first Scandinavian attempt to find the North-West Passage. Jens Munk was born in Southern Norway in 1579. He left Norway and went into Dutch service. He first made a voyage to Brazil and spent 6 years in Bahia before returning to Copenhagen via Amsterdam. It is believed that the idea for this voyage originated from Munk himself. Both the king and the court were fully aware of what a shorter route north of America to China and India would mean for the trade, and were therefore positive to Munk's plans. There was prestige in this project and no doubt there was also some envy in looking at the recent English attempts in the region. Not least regarding Hudson's attempt, whose map of 1612 Munk probably used. The voyage was fatal. The 2 ships, with 65 persons, left Copenhagen in 1619. In Hudon Bay 62 members of the crew died and only Munk and no of his men survived. These 3 men made an astonishing deed in sailing the small vessel "Laprenen" back to Norway where it arrived on September 25th, 1620.

From his first expedition, crossing the Greenland ice from east to west in 1888. This first actual expedition of Fridtjof Nansen became very important in many ways. He gained extensive experience in Arctic conditions, not least by spending the winter among the Inuit people. By this Norwegian expedition succeeding in crossing the ice sheet, it was to become decisive for himself as a polar explorer.

Scientifically, the biologist Nansen collected samples from the inland ice ridge to be able to prove the former seabed, and thus confirm the theory that the land mass had risen from the sea. He also made observations of biology, geology and weather as well as recording coastal stretches.

Nansen wrote several diaries on the expedition. He has in principle divided the diaries according to stages of the journey. This diary runs from the end of May to the middle of August 1888, the period from the stay in Dynafjord in Iceland to the landing on the east coast of Greenland. The diary begins at the entrance to Isafjord in Iceland. Several beautiful sketches and descriptions can be found from the geological reconnaissance trip in Dynafjord.

The crossing of the ice mass off the east coast of Greenland is perhaps the largest achievement on this expedition.

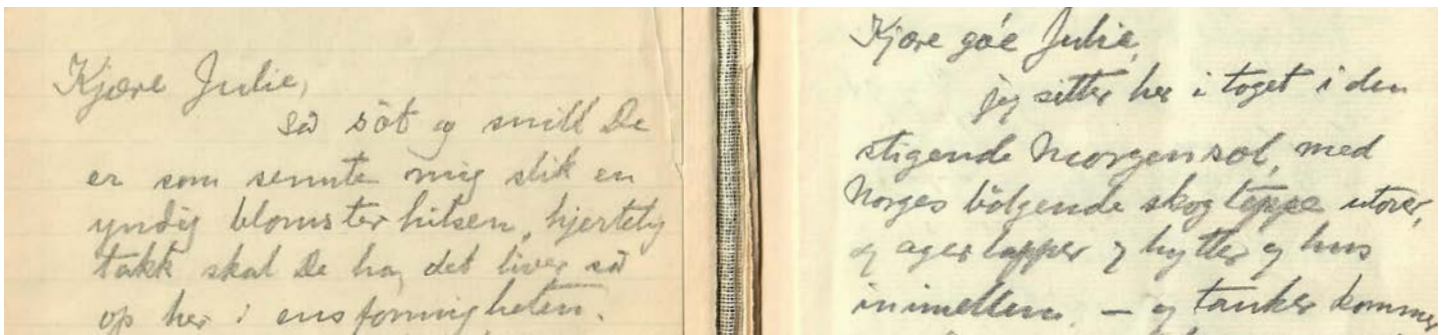
In Nansen's book about the Greenland voyage, *The First crossing of Greenland*, this stage of the expedition is described in chapters IV, V, VII-IX, XI-XIII. The original diary naturally gives a different picture of the trip than the book does. Authenticity flows from the densely written pages. It's almost like you smell the contrast between the clear air outside and the strong stench among 60 men inside *Jason*. You can imagine the large masses of ice with seals that must be forced by boat and sledge and feel the eternal rocking ice beneath you. The diaries from immediately before and after this diary that we have described here are kept in the National Library. Norland's part excels in its sketches and drawings, several of which are in color.

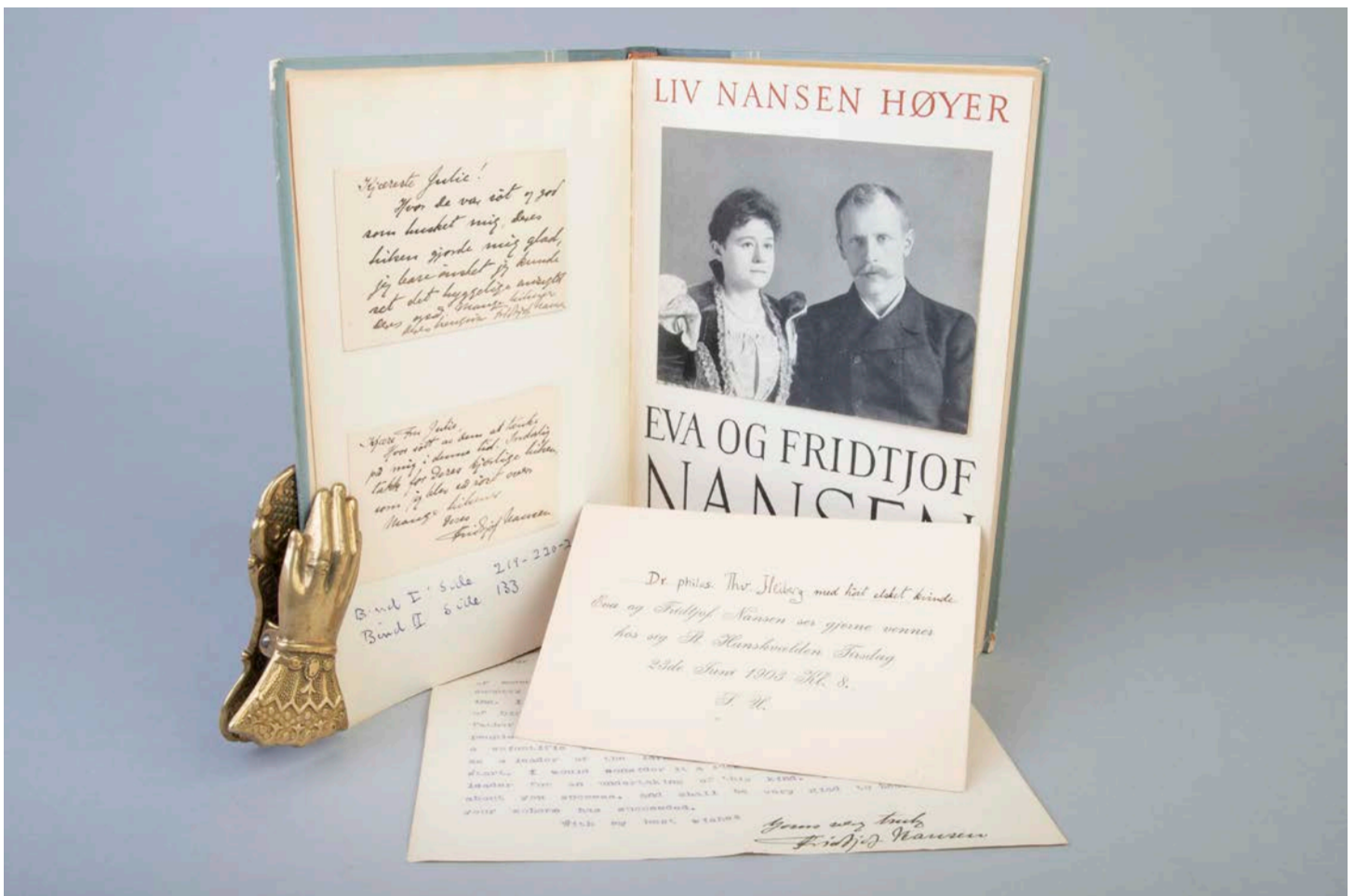

She was married to Thorvald Heiberg, son of Axel Heiberg, co-financer of the expeditions of Nansen and Sverdrup to Greenland. The typed letter is for Thorvald Heiberg, as a respond for him asking Nansen for recommendation for a trip to England to raise money for his water-power plans.

The letters and calling cards for Julie Heiberg are pasted into the book *Eva and Fridtjof Nansen* (1954), written by Liv Nansen Høyer. The book is INSCRIBED by Liv Nansen Høyer to Julie and Thorvald Heiberg. LAID IN: Invitation card [June 23, 1903], from Eva and Fridtjof Nansen for Dr. Philos Thv. Heiber with his highly beloved woman [not wife!].

In the letters to Julie, Nansen writes in an unusual soft and gentle tone. "I must send you a greeting with thanks for the short minutes we spent together, so unexpected and pleasant". "You are enchanting, as a light beam you come sliding in, lighting up even the grey corners, and it smiles towards you". Nansen's relation to Julie Heiberg is described on pp. 219-221 in the book. It mentions a an occasion when there was held a party for Prince Eugen, and Nansen took Julie Heiberg, the youngest person present, as his guest at the table. Julie danced with the Prince and Nansen all night.

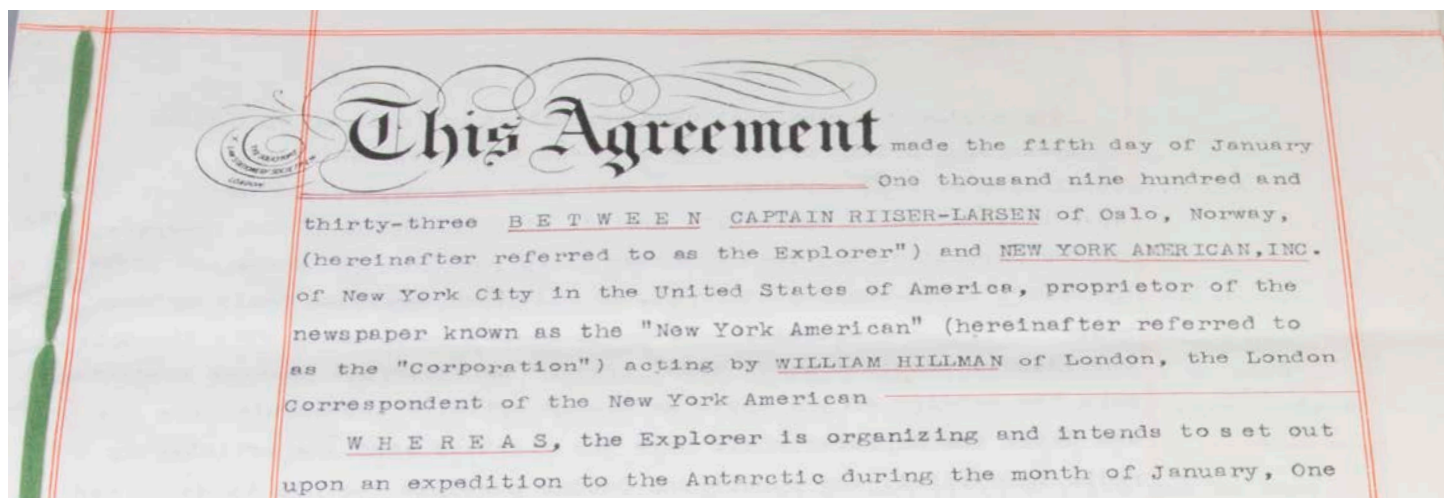
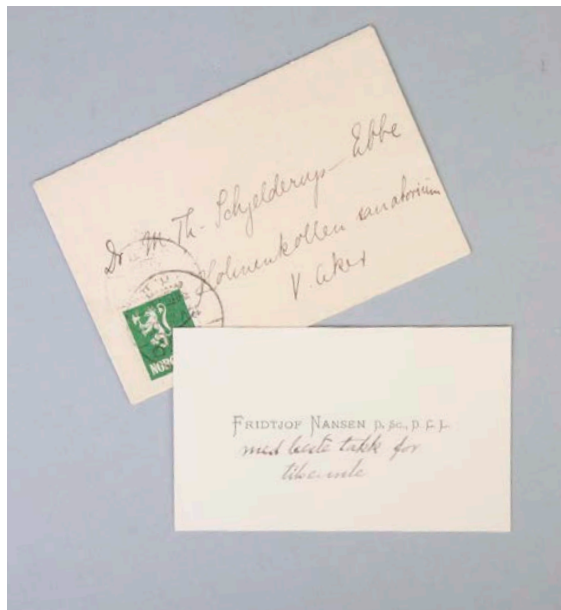

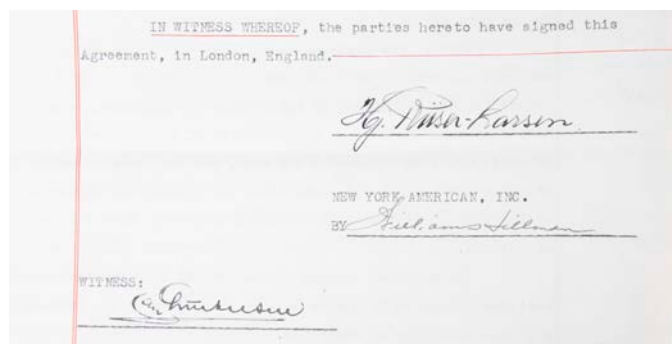

To Sir Lewis Beaumont [1847-1922], Royal Navy officer, senior lieutenant in the British Arctic Expedition led by George Nares on HMS Discovery, an attempt to reach the North Pole and to explore the NW coast of Greenland [1875/76].

To "My dear Sir Lewis": It has occurred to Scott that "it would be an act of wisdom to leave somewhere in England a document dealing with the various possibilities which may interfere with the working of my programme. Such a document might be useful to allay public anxiety as well as to indicate the direction in which action might be taken should the Terra Nova fail to return from the ice at the appointed dates". Scott discusses with whom the document should be left "and every consideration points to you [...] It is essential it should be in the hands of some polar authority [...] Sir Edgar Speyer is the principal worker and I shall leave the financial details in his hands [...] Naturally I do not anticipate any difficulties".

Scott's last Expedition. The "Terra Nova" sailed from Cardiff on June 15, 1910, but Scott did not join till the ship reached South Africa in September.

The news of the disaster to Scott & his companions did not reach Europe till February 1913 – when the sea & the bodies were found 8 months later. A Memorial Service had been held in St. Paul's on Feb. 14, the day before Mrs Scott's letter. Cherry-Garrard, early in March 1912, set out alone with dog-teams and a Russian dog-driver to speed the return of the polar party but a four days blizzard at One Ton Depot forced his return. He was a member of the search party which found the bodies of Scott, Wilson & Bowers who had died within only 11 miles of One Ton Depot & learned then of Oates self-sacrifice & Petty Officer Evans earlier collapse. Cherry-Garrard never ceased to reproach himself for not having continued.

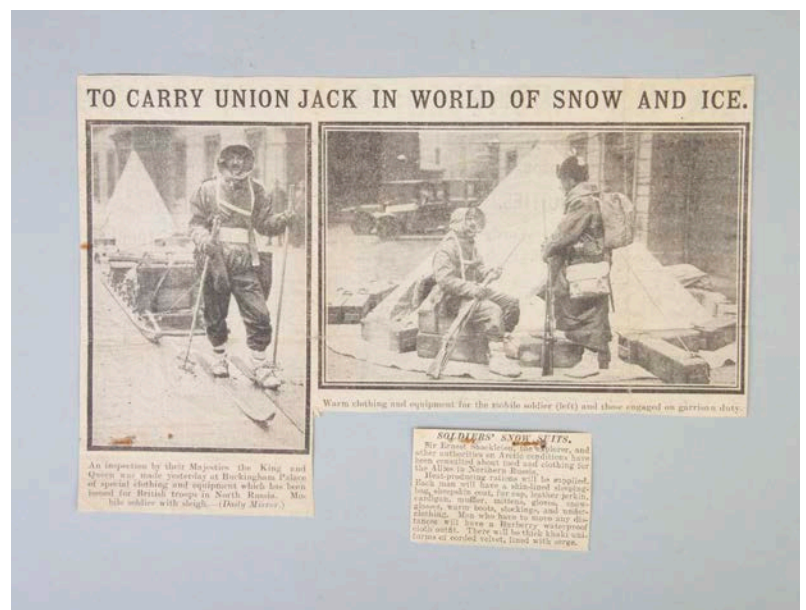

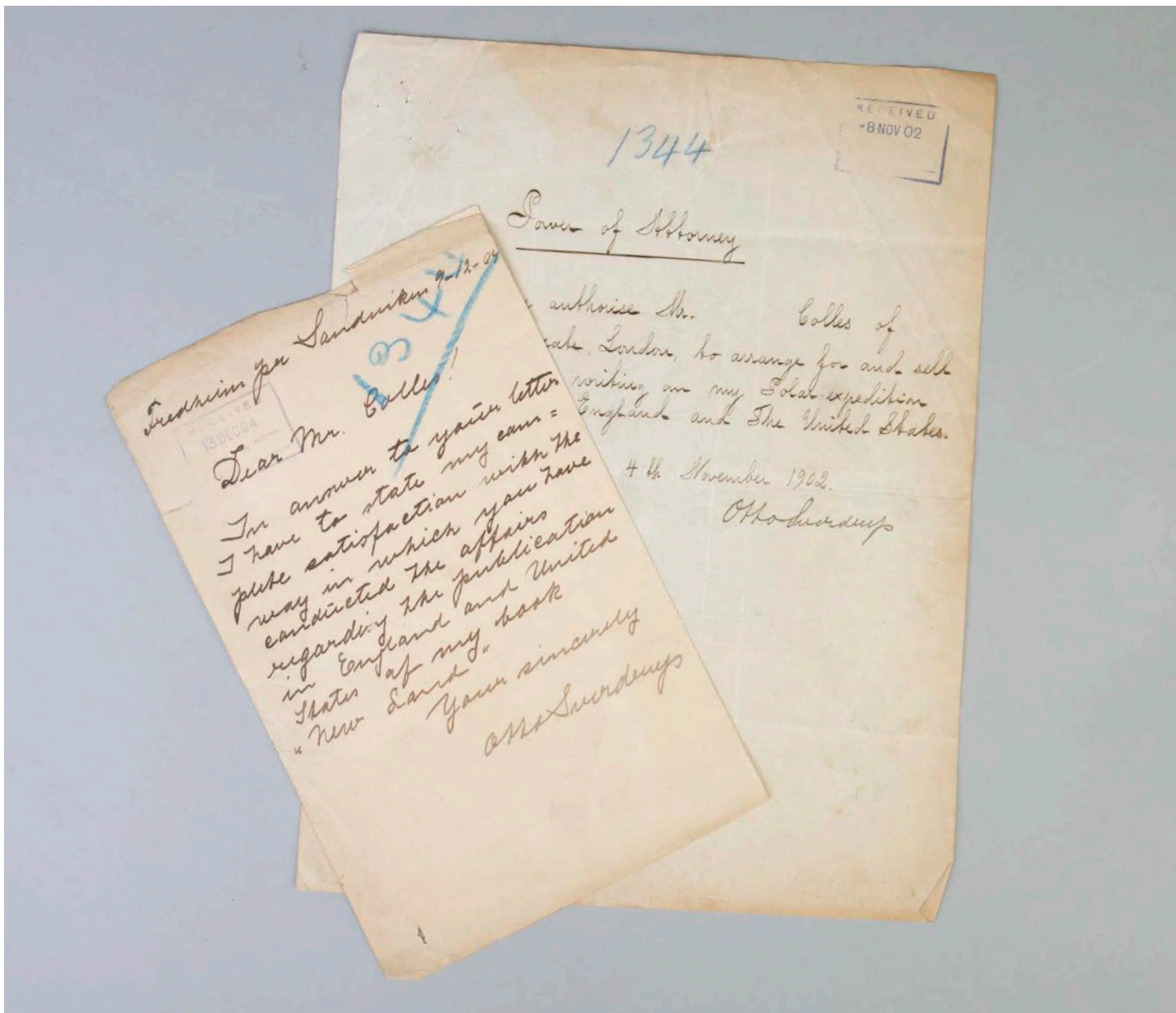
